Local diverse histories workshops: book now for February 2020 onwards

Hackney Museum is currently taking bookings for sessions from its [local diverse histories programme](#), which use object handling, discussion and child-led learning to explore a variety of topics. These workshops can be booked at various times. Sessions include:

Suitcase Stories (suitable for KS1 & KS2)

This session gives an overview of Hackney's history, from the Anglo Saxons to the present day, via the Victorians, World War II and the Windrush Generation.

Neanderthals of Hackney

In collaboration with Queen Mary University, a newly devised workshop about life in Hackney in the Paleolithic period.

Windrush & Beyond

Find out about the experiences of the people who migrated from the Caribbean to Hackney as part of the Windrush Generation and how life in the 'Mother Country' differed from the expectations.
