Two young children go on a mission and must release six beasts from villainous hands.

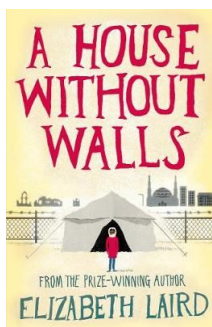
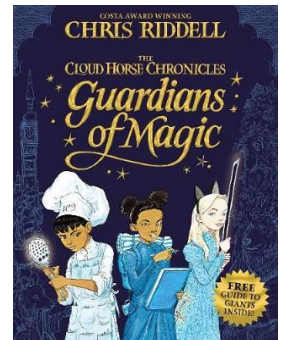

Three young women, from very diverse backgrounds, join the Suffragette movement and must consider the sacrifices such a decision entails.

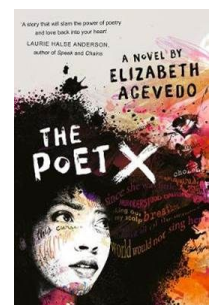

Fifteen year old Xiomara works through the tension and conflict in her family by writing poetry

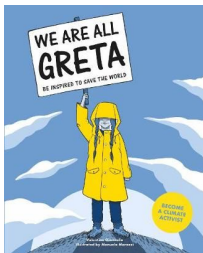
