

Highlights of the Week

On Monday 27th January, 8 Year 10 students participated in the Hackney Holocaust Memorial Day Ceremony at the Hackney Town Hall, along with members of the local community including religious leaders and politicians. The students read the story of Gino Bartali, a former Tour de France champion who, at great personal risk to himself, rejected the fascism of Mussolini and smuggled documents abroad which allowed the safe passage of Jewish people, thus saving hundreds of lives.

The theme of the day was "Standing Together". The students were able to hear from a Holocaust survivor, observe a Jewish prayer for the dead as well as hear contributions from other schools and local community organisations. The organiser told Mr Harvey, Head of RE, "your students were, as ever, a credit to Haggerston School."

IMPORTANT NOTICES

Attendance to school and GCSE outcomes

If your child only attended school for four days of every week, on average over the year, his/her attendance will be approximately 80%. A child who misses half a day per week on average will typically be around 90%.

Your child's attendance should ideally be 100% every week. We know from our own data that our students achieve their best when they are here every day. The less a child attends, the lower their overall GCSE outcomes.

The average GCSE grade for a child with 97% attendance is grade 7 or better. Compare this to a child with 90% attendance whose average grade is nearer a 3 and it will be clear why we worry about those children who do not attend school every day.

Children also lose significant learning time if they are repeatedly late to period 1. Your child should aim to arrive at school by 8.30am every day.

Medicines

If your child has a minor cough or cold, please send them to school. We will send them home if needed.

For minor injuries or ailments, paracetamol (and or other medication) can be given to reception and taken in school if necessary.

Medical appointments

Please keep these to non-school hours. If a medical appointment is urgent and has to happen in school time, the child must bring evidence of the appointment with them or the absence will be unauthorised.

Lateness

All children must be in school by 8.30am. If children are late, they are issued three corrections. If further discussion is required about this, the child would need to see their Head of Year.

Holidays

We cannot authorise holidays in term time and fines are issued where this happens. Please check the term dates before holidays are booked.
