The Access Project is a charity that works with students who are from backgrounds that are underrepresented at the UK's top universities across years 10 to 13. We provide free academic tutoring and in school mentoring to students who have the academic potential to attend a top university. A dedicated member of staff known as the 'University Access Officer' works in Haggerston for two days a week, Miss Clarke. We are currently recruiting year 9 students to join the programme. This is a fantastic opportunity for students to not only receive academic support and guidance but to also partake in exclusive enrichment activities such as our annual trip to Cambridge University. Students on the programme are proven to be four times as likely to go to a top university than other students with the same academic record and background. External analysis also shows that our GCSE students make on average half a grade more progress than classmates, in tutored subjects. This is truly a unique opportunity not to be missed!

Closing 21st May


Next Generation Economics is a chance for students to write about the biggest economic challenges facing their generation in 2021. This competition asks students in years 10-13 to submit an 800 word letter to the FCDO Chief Economist addressing one of two questions. The competition is aiming to tackle a lack of diversity in the economics profession by reaching students who would not otherwise consider studying economics. Winning entries win £250.
