MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Ms Emmerson

Dear Parents/Carers,

I have really enjoyed each of the celebration assemblies this week. Seeing so many students collecting awards and the wide range of achievements has made me very proud. You will soon be receiving the Haggerston Recorder, which gives a flavour of all the other events that have taken place this term and showcases some of this excellence.

You will also be receiving your child's Spring Term report, which consists of a simplified one page report and a set of instructions for accessing the more detailed information on the DPR which will give you an insight into the particular areas of the curriculum your child is secure in and the areas they need more practice and consolidation in. Your child should be able to explain their DPR report to you in more detail because they should have a better understanding of their own curriculum. In fact, getting them to explain it is a great way for them to practise articulating their learning and understanding what they need to improve on. Holidays are a great opportunity to pause and reflect so that children can start next term with a clear sense of what to focus on next.

I would also like to update you on some refinements we are planning to make to our curriculum structure for the coming year. These are partly as a response to Ofsted's recommendation that we review our literacy and numeracy withdrawal and partly because of the evolving profile of SEND needs across the school:

- 1.KS4 Literacy withdrawal will happen on a rotational basis, in smaller groups or individually to allow for more personalised support in the specific areas students are weaker in. Students will either come out of the same lesson each week for a time limited period (e.g. 6 weeks), or come out of different lessons each week, on a longer term basis. If your child needs this additional support, you will be notified. Lexia interventions will continue to run after school for those students who need it.
- 2.KS4 Literacy will continue as it is currently for the next year 11 cohort. From Year 10 onwards, however, it will be done differently. We will create two additional English sets, much smaller in size, for students who need more support with their reading and writing. They will take Functional English and English Language GCSEs, instead of Literature. This will enable the department to tailor the texts they study to the needs and abilities of the students and allow a sharper focus on ensuring every child leaves with a strong foundation in reading and writing.
- 3. KS3 Numeracy withdrawal will continue as it currently is in Year 7, focusing on 'catch up' for children without age-appropriate numeracy skills on entry to the school. Selected students will study this in place of Spanish but, in Years 8 and 9, will pick up Spanish in a separate group from the wider cohort, tailored for beginner language learners. This will enable them to access the full range of subjects in the curriculum whilst still accessing specialist teaching in Maths to boost their skills.
- 4. We are introducing an ASDAN qualification for a small group of students from Year 10. This course teaches practical life skills to students who are better suited to more vocational or bespoke pathways. This course will ensure the curriculum is adapted for the full range of abilities and needs within our cohort.

Finally, an end of term uniform update. From the start of next term, summer uniform rules apply. This means that jumpers are no longer compulsory. Please check that your child's school skirt still fits them and will be worn to the knee. Trousers should be worn around the waist (not hips) with a belt if necessary. We will be resetting expectations around this at the start of next term. Hoodies are never allowed in school and trainers are only permitted if there is a medical reason. As always, we appreciate your support with ensuring your child wears their uniform appropriately.

Thank you for all you have done to support your child and the school this term.


Music Lessons






