MESSAGE FROM ASSOCIATE HEADTEACHER

Ms Turbet

Dear Parents/ Carers.

At Haggerston we are very fortunate to have a team of excellent teachers who go above and beyond to support the young people that they teach. Senior staff regularly visit classrooms - when we visit classrooms we are looking to see high quality explanations and lots of opportunities for students to deliberately practice what they have been taught. We also look for the opportunities for students to "think hard" - how much does questioning from the teacher probe their understanding; how is the learning of all students being checked (lots of use of mini whiteboards for whole class responses); how are all students being expected to engage in the lesson at all times?

As a school this year, we are focusing some of our CPD on the routines that we use in the classroom. Evidence shows that the more routines are embedded across each classroom, the more that students accept that this is the "normal" behaviour that is expected in school. These routines include an expectation that students are showing good listening habits at all times; that all students are expected to respond when we use mini whiteboards; that all students are expected to talk about the work with their partners when instructed to do so. If we allow some students to not engage in these tasks we are lowering our expectations of them and what they are able to achieve.

Another part of our curriculum development work has focussed on developing Knowledge Organisers. Families should have seen the printed Knowledge Organisers that students are given each term. These Knowledge Organisers are fully aligned with the curriculum that we teach and are reviewed regularly by departments. Knowledge organisers are used in lessons so that students are able to refer back to the key knowledge required for a particular topic, but also so that students have a reference point for their home learning. For families they provide a really useful reference point to be able to talk to the students about what they have been learning and then how they have been applying this knowledge in the classroom.

You could ask:

- "What have you been learning about in History this term? The topic in your knowledge organiser looks really interesting."
- "In your knowledge organisers there are some really interesting quotes about the book you have been studying. Why are these quotes important?"
- "Tell me about this part of the topic in Geography? What has your teacher been asking you to do?"
- "The play you have been studying in Drama is one I don't know. Can you tell me about it? How have you been discussing this in class?"
- "Some of the vocabulary in your knowledge organiser for DT is really complex! Can you explain it to me? How do you use this vocabulary in the lesson?"

Register for free school meals - message from Hackney Education

Families who are eligible for free school meals (FSM) need to register to ensure they receive all the benefits they are entitled to. Their schools will then receive pupil premium funding, worth £1,455 to schools for each child. This will give schools more money for activities such as educational trips, booster classes, after-school clubs and more, which is important additional funding to support your child's school.

Registering will ensure families receive other benefits they may be entitled to, like food vouchers during the holidays or access to the holiday activity fund. It's simple to register and is confidential.






