MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Ms Emmerson

Dear Parents/Carers,

It has been great to welcome students back this week, looking smart in new uniforms and with pristine pencil cases! Thank you for ensuring your child has everything they need for their learning. Welcome also to our new Year 7 families; it was lovely to meet so many of you this week. We are excited to meet parents over the coming weeks for our annual Parent Information Evenings, when we will share strategies to support your child to be successful in their journey through the school.

It feels only right, in this first bulletin of the year, to congratulate all our outgoing Year 11 and 13 students on a fantastic set of examination results. Despite grade boundaries and pass rates returning to the pre-pandemic standards of 2019, both year groups achieved the best results the school has ever had, by some margin.

In Year 11,

- 78% of students passed both English and Maths, a 15% increase from last year and 19% increase from 2019. 55% of students achieved above a grade 5 in both subjects.
- All of the core subjects had pass rates over 80% with significant increases from last year (Eg 90% of students achieved 4+ in English Literature, an increase of 17% from 2022)
- Our overall progress score is likely to be around +0.5, which is equivalent to half a grade above national average in every subject.

In Year 13,

- 55% of all grades awarded were A*-B
- A quarter of students achieved at least grades AAB in facilitating subjects
- 44% of students went on to places at Russell Group Universities (more than double the London average), including two students to Oxbridge
- The progress score for the 6th form puts us in the top 25% of all sixth forms nationally many subjects (Eg. English, Maths, History, Spanish, Sociology) are in the top 10% or 5%.

We are incredibly proud of these achievements, which are a real reflection of the hard work of students and staff over a number of years. These outcomes are among the best in the borough but we will continue to work to drive improvement and ensure that the school is providing the best possible education for every child. I am grateful also to parents, who supported us on this journey of improvement, providing the environment in which their child could thrive.

I know, without any doubt, that this coming year's results will be even better and I am impressed by the strong start made by students this week.

Start of Year Reminders:

- Your child can have a free, healthy breakfast every morning in the canteen.
- Winter Uniform (ie. jumpers) normally resumes from September. Due to the warm weather this week and at the start of next week, we are allowing flexibility around jumpers and students are allowed to remove blazers in lessons and during social time.
- If your child wears a skirt, please check it still fits them. A number of students have returned with skirts well above the knee.
- If your child does not have a device to complete homework, please make use of our Chromebook loan scheme. Contact **Patrick.McArdle@haggerston.hackney.sch.uk** if you would like more information.

If last year, a child had 99-100% attendance, the average grade achieved across all GCSEs was a grade 7. This does not mean a child is guaranteed to achieve grade 7s or better with 99-100% attendance but it does mean they give themselves the best chance to do this. This child is much likely to score top grades than someone who is only in for 94 % of the school year.



Dear parents, HiP is a voluntary group of Hackney parents with SEND children, trying to be heard & listened to, to improve services, and to develop awareness, understanding & acceptance of SEND in our communities. Please see the following fliers that you hopefully find useful.



Preparing for Adulthood (PfA) - Briefing to share with parent/carer contacts to seek their engagement in the process of developing the Hackney PfA Strategy

Young people identified as having special educational needs and disabilities (SEND) have the same aims and hopes as everyone else. Their needs can mean that they experience barriers to this full engagement and achievement, and may need extra support to enable them to move successfully into adulthood and reach their full potential.

Hackney Council is working with parents, carers, children and young people to develop a strategy to prepare young people with SEND for adulthood. The strategy will focus on building upon and improving existing provision around the four key 'Preparing for Adulthood' (PfA) outcomes from the SEND Code of Practice (2014); employment; independent living; participating within an inclusive community, and health and wellbeing.

The strategy is to be co-produced across Education, Health and Social Care as well as in partnership with families, schools and colleges. This brief is intended for services supporting & working closely with parents and carers to enable them to seek co-production partners to join a Task & Finish Group in order to assist us in drawing up the Hackney PfA Strategy and subsequent action plan to deliver it.

The strategy and action plan will be monitored and overseen by the SEND Partnership Board to ensure that we remain focussed on the right priorities and are making good progress towards them, so as to improve outcomes for young people with SEND in Hackney

Initially we envisage 2/3 meetings in the Autumn term to reach a point where we have a draft

strategy to consult upon by January 2024. Meetings will be virtual and last 1-1.5 hours each. We would like to recruit 4 parent/carer representatives. Ideally this 4 would be made of a parent/ carer of a young person who:

- Attends Mainstream secondary
- Attends Special school Attends College
- Attends College
 Who has previously experienced transition to adulthood

However, if we do have a high level of interest we will endeavour to maximise participation wherever possible. Any interested parent/carer should contact Paul Richardson or Nadia Sica for further information (contact details below).
