Dear Parents/Carers,

One of the great things about working in a school (especially post pandemic!) is seeing the impact of trips on students. This week, a large group of students arrived with tents, backpacks and walking boots to undertake their Silver Duke of Edinburgh expedition. We are particularly proud to be one of the schools with the highest completion rate for Bronze, Silver and Gold awards, a testament to the hard work of Mr James (Head of PE and Outdoor Education). The D of E award remains extra curricular achievement favoured most by employers, probably because it involves a substantial commitment from students, in the year leading up to and during the expedition itself. It is with great pleasure that I am writing to you today. This year Inclusion has seen a favourable Ofsted inspection that commented on the strengths of Inclusion at Haggerston, which we are very proud of.

We also have offered various workshops for parents and will continue to offer these in the upcoming year delivered either directly by us or specialists and / or Hackney Education. Inclusion values the contribution of parents, families and our young people, so we have increased our communication presence not only through meetings, phone calls and letters but also through Classcharts, where now you can directly see if your child / young person has an intervention or communication took place. We have worked relentlessly on ensuring our young people's needs are met either through the universal offer, whole school SEND offer or targeted specialist support and statutory routes. This includes internal interventions, direct support from specialists such as Speech and language therapist or external assessments to better understand students' needs and with that connected increase of communication with yourselves.

## **Children & Family Hubs Consultation**

Give your feedback on Hackney Council's model for Children and Family Hubs.

We are consulting on how we develop some of our existing children's centres into four Children and Family Hubs.

Hubs will offer support for families and young people aged 0 to 19 years old (up to 25 for young people with special educational needs and disabilities – SEND).

The hubs will bring together staff working across a range of different services, including the Council, health services and voluntary and community organisations.

The hubs will act as a 'one stop shop' to offer guidance and advice for families, including infant feeding, debt and welfare advice, mental health support, health services and family support.

The MET police Central Youth Team, are currently running a project, offering parent/carer engagement sessions in partnership with PACE UK (Parents Against Sexual Exploitation).

The input will also include a lived experience speaker who will explain how they themselves became involved with gangs and exploitation. The charity will also offer long term support to anyone who needs it or believes their young people have been or are being exploited.
