## CONSULTATION ON THE PROPOSAL TO JOIN COMMUNITY SCHOOLS TRUST (CST)

Over the past 18 months, Haggerston School governing body has undergone a detailed and fully open-minded process of review of our current status as a local authority maintained school. The board of governors have agreed to move forward with proposals to join a multi academy trust.

The key reasons for this decision are:

- To contribute to and benefit from a collaborative model where best practice and expertise are shared, providing wider professional development opportunities for staff and educational opportunities for students.
- To use this collaboration to help us deliver continued and sustainable improvement in educational standards, underpinned by our distinctive ethos and values.
- To respond to changes in the local and national landscape, ensuring that decisions about our future are taken in a considered, timely and strategic way, so that our opportunities are maximised and our unique identity as a school is protected.

We have gone through a rigorous process to identify a trust whose values are aligned to our own and who are committed to maintaining the distinctive culture and ethos of Haggerston School. Our preferred partner is Community Schools Trust, who we have worked with, in an informal capacity, over a number of years.

Community Schools Trust evolved from the success of Forest Gate Community School, which went on a steep journey of improvement from a 'Requires Improvement' school in 2013 to an 'Outstanding' school in 2016. Forest Gate now has outcomes in the top 1% of schools in the country (it is regularly in the top 20 schools nationally). This success led to academisation in 2016 to enable the school to broaden its support for other local schools, helping them to improve and develop. The trust now has 4 schools:

Forest Gate Community School, Newham	Outstanding school with a progress score of 1.08 (National average is -0.03)
Cumberland Community School, Newham	Was judged to require improvement in 2016. Now, a securely 'Good' school with a progress score of 0.55 (National average is -0.03)
Waterside Academy, Hackney	After Hackney New School was judged to be 'Inadequate' in all areas by Ofsted in 2019, CST was asked to take the school on to improve it. The school has now secured a 'Good' Ofsted judgement in all areas and results are improving rapidly.
University Technical College, Norfolk	UTCN is a specialist technical college in the East of England, with a 'Good' Ofsted judgement in all areas
After a period of instability in 2022, CST was also asked to provide leadership support to The Petchey Academy, who have since become an associate member of the trust.	

CST is a small trust who are committed to working with schools in a collaborative way, allowing individual schools to retain a high level of autonomy over their curriculum, teaching and identity.

Consequently, we are now inviting you to engage in this consultation process to join CST Trust. We are consulting with all stakeholders on the proposals to join CST.

# MESSAGE FROM HEAD OF YEAR 9

*Mr Wadsworth*

Although I have communicated with you via email and letter already this academic year It is nice for me to be able to write to you for the first time in our parent bulletin. I hope this message finds you all well.

I wanted to start with a reminder of some key dates, of which more information can be found below:

- February 6th: GCSE options information event (virtual)
- February 21st: Year 9 parents evening (face to face)

Firstly, I would like to thank you for your continued support and encouragement of the students so far this year. It has made my own transition from last year's Year 11 cohort to the current Year 9s, much smoother. I feel extremely fortunate and lucky to have been asked to take over the year group, giving me the opportunity to get to know and work with such a dynamic, aspiring and diverse set of students.

As you are aware, the time for students to select their GCSE options is fast approaching and we have several ways in which we have been supporting the Year 9s during this period. Please see the information below from Mr McArdle (Assistant Headteacher who is in charge of this process):

*On Monday 6th February at 6pm we will be launching our online (Virtual) options information event. This will include links to informative videos about the options process, individual subject videos and our 2022/23 Options booklet.*

*At Haggerston, we run a route model. This allows students to follow a course route that is suited to their ability and needs. Irrespective of which route they study, all students will continue to study the core academic subjects of English Literature, English Language, Maths and Science. More information about these routes will be provided on the evening of the 6th of February through the material shared.*

*As parents, the first step is to read the booklet and watch the videos with your child and discuss the options available to them. In particular, it is important to know which subjects they enjoy the most and what aspirations they may already have for future study or careers. You should also consider your child's outcomes from their previous DPR reports so that you know which subjects they have shown good aptitude and potential in. You will also have the opportunity to discuss your child's current progress with their class teachers on Parents' evening.*

*On Tuesday 21st of February during Year 9 parents evening there will be an option to attend a pop in session to discuss options directly with me during the evening. Here I will try to provide clarity to any questions you may have following the material shared on the 6th, and I will explain the process again should you need support. Year 9 parents' evening is a great opportunity to find out what your child needs to do to improve and their prospects for continued study in their option subjects. I hope you find the material we will share at 6pm on Monday the 6th of February useful and I look forward to speaking to some of you directly on the 21st of February. Information on how to book parents evening slots will be shared with you all soon.*

Alongside the virtual options evening, students have had the opportunity to take part in short taster sessions of some of the new subjects on offer such as; business, economics and sociology. All Year 9 students also took part in a 'careers carousel' in which they had the opportunity to speak to professionals from different areas about their day to day working lives, the path they took to get to where they are now and other areas of interest. We are also giving over time during our assembly and tutor time slot for Heads of Faculty to promote their subject via videos and live presentations.

Another major highlight for both myself and Ms Willing so far this year is the students' achievements in various areas of the school. Each week, during assembly, we celebrate the successes of the previous week. Names of students who

have achieved 3 or more citations are read out so they can stand and receive the recognition of their peers. This started with around 15 pupils but each week there is an increase in this number. Prior to the Christmas break I was overwhelmed by the number of students who achieved this - 89 students, nearly 50% of the cohort.

I have also been privileged to be part of the JP Morgan schools challenge alongside 16 of our Year 9 students. So far students have developed a business name, slogan and a prototype model of a product designed to tackle the serious issue of climate change and pollution of our land, sea and air. Recently the 16 students took part in a workshop day where they produced some very impressive models that they will eventually use to showcase their pitch to a panel of judges in an attempt to beat the competition from 12 other London schools.

Finally, we are also approaching our second assessment cycle (DPR 2) which begins the first week back after the February half term. Year 9 students are not issued with a timetable for these assessments but the dates will be shared by individual class teachers via the DPR no later than February 6th. As always, we ask for your continued support in ensuring that students are completing their revision and supplementing their classroom knowledge whilst at home. All students now have a half term 2 knowledge organiser to support them with this.

I look forward to talking with, and meeting with, more of you on February 21st at the Parents Evening event but in the meantime please do not hesitate to contact myself or Miss Willing if you have any questions



If last year, a child had 99-100% attendance, the average grade achieved across all GCSEs was a grade 7. This does not mean a child is guaranteed to achieve grade 7s or better with 99-100% attendance but it does mean they give themselves the best chance to do this. This child is much likely to score top grades than someone who is only in for 94 % of the school year.

### Music Lessons


Individual and paired music lessons start next week. If your child is taking these you should have received an email with a timetable of your child's lessons and further information.
