# MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

#### Ms Emmerson

Dear Parents/Carers,

I will keep my message very brief this week as there is an important letter below from Wendy Mason, Chair of Governors, about the decision regarding academisation and joining Community Schools Trust.

I do, however, need to outline arrangements for Tuesday 4th May, which is a further strike day. The school will be open to Year 11 and 13 students only on this day, with the following arrangements:

- Year 11 students should attend school at the normal time (by 8.40am) and will be dismissed at 12.45. They will have bespoke revision sessions. Packed lunches will be provided for students eligible for free school meals.
- Year 11 student who are involved in exam moderation for PE/Sport must be in school for the full day and should attend wearing PE kit. Lunch will be provided for these students.
- Year 13 will also have a bespoke programme of revision and will be sent a schedule by the 6th form team. They should attend for each of the sessions they are invited to. A quiet, supervised study space will be available all day for 6th form students.

I understand this disruption to students' learning is far from ideal and I sincerely hope that the dispute will be resolved soon. I appreciate your support during this period.

Dear Parent/Carer,

The governing body met yesterday to make a decision whether to proceed to academisation or not, joining Community Schools Trust. We decided unanimously that academisation was in the best interests of Haggerston School, its students, staff and wider stakeholders and that the future of the school and the quality of education we provide to the community would be more secure with the support of Community Schools Trust.

#### Key considerations which influenced our decision are:

- Falling rolls in Hackney and the need to secure our future, within an increasingly competitive local landscape. In particular, to mitigate the risk of mandatory roll reduction or closure, opportunities to develop our specialism in performing arts, access to support/expertise for marketing and the ability to have more control over in-year admissions.
- The opportunity for close collaboration with a school within the top 50 nationally (Forest Gate Community School), to help us to continue to improve outcomes and progress for students, particularly in the core subjects of English, Maths and Science.
- The ability to work strategically with the trust to support staff recruitment and retention in the context of national teacher shortage.
- To be able to offer outstanding professional development opportunities to staff through a model of school to school improvement and peer support.
- To be able to further develop our sixth form, working with other providers to develop expertise in the new T-Levels, as well as lending our support to other centres to help them to improve their provision, as we have over the past 6 years.

As shared previously, the Department for Education has approved an academy order permitting the school to proceed to academisation. School leaders will now work with the Department for Education, the local authority and CST to make progress towards academisation with the intention that conversion will take place before the new academic year.

Governors feel it is important to reiterate that we remain committed to being a fully inclusive, comprehensive school, who would continue to work constructively with the local authority and other Hackney schools in service of the local community. Our core values and unique identity will remain firmly in place and the opportunities presented by this collaboration will help us to ensure the school continues to grow from strength to strength in the coming years.





Hackney is developing new Children and Family Hubs, to better meet families' social care, education, mental and physical health needs. Specialists will be able to better help families by working together in a coordinated way, sharing information and providing tailored support.
