# MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

*Ms Emmerson*

Dear Parents/Carers,

This week, I would like to acknowledge the hard work of all students throughout the exam season but particularly our Year 10 students. At the beginning of the year, we had some concerns about the general level of motivation and engagement of this year group. As the year has progressed, there has been a notable change in attitude and we have been very proud of the maturity and resilience they have shown over the past few weeks of the mock exam period. Invigilators have praised their conduct; teachers have been impressed by their diligence and independence. On Wednesday, which will be a strike day for most of the school, we will be inviting some parents to meet with members of the leadership team to look at ways to support their progress as they embark on Year 11. We will hold more of these meetings in September, and throughout next term, so that we really understand the needs of individual students.

When I arrived at school this morning, I was greeted with an email from a parent of a child in another local school. She wanted to thank the seven Year 10 Haggerston students who had spotted that her 11 year old daughter was being followed and bullied by another group of pupils. They had intervened, escorted her daughter to the bus stop and stayed with her until she boarded the bus. It made me so proud to hear of such kindness on the part of our Year 10 students. Not all of the reports I have from members of the public are so positive but this one really demonstrated the character and values of Haggerston students.

We celebrated our outgoing Year 11 cohort this week at a fantastic prom and I was reminded how quickly the years had flown by. Ms Yiminyi and Ms Khan worked incredibly hard to put together a wonderful event and students had a great time. In a blink of an eye, we will have a new Year 11 cohort and our current Year 10s are shaping up to be every bit as successful and accomplished as their predecessors.

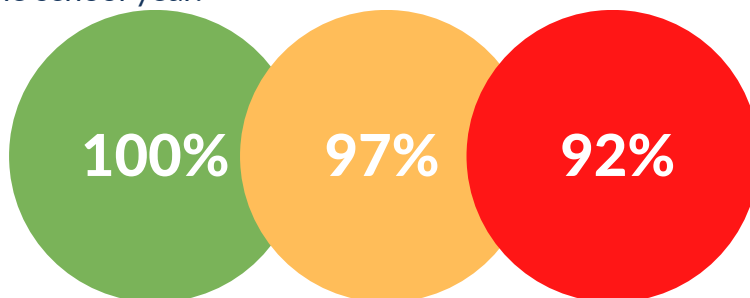


## WHERE WILL YOU BE?
